

## 1747-1751 – Peter Burr testifies against Jacob Hite – Frederick Co VA Court Order Book

Frederick County, Virginia, Court Order Book, 1747 -1751

It is ordered that David Lloyd pay Peter Burr seventy five pounds of tobacco for attending three days as evidence for him against Jacob Hite.

It is ordered that David Lloyd pay Benjamin Bradley two hundred and twenty five pounds of tobacco for attending nine days in evidence for him against Jacob Hite.

A deed of bargain and sale from David Lloyd to Peter Burr and Henry Lloyd was proved by the oaths of Robert Buckles and Benjamin Bradley two of the witnesses there to the same is ordered to lay for further proof.

David Lloyd, plaintiff, on petition against Joseph Hite defendant.

The defendant being called and failing to appear the plaintiff in court produced the defendant's note of hand for two pounds and eighteen shillings Pennsylvania money. Therefore it is considered by the court that the said plaintiff recover against the said defendant the sum of two pounds eight shillings and six pence Virginia money the value of the said two pounds eighteen shillings Pennsylvania money and costs of suit against the defendant in ....

Under the Petition of David Lloyd under execution in a judgment of this court obtained against him by John Smith administrator of John Miller deceased for the sum of forty four pounds current money to be discharged on payment of twenty two pounds current money with lawful interest thereon from the 22d day of June 1747 and costs of suit praying relief in equity. The petitioner having filed his injunction Bill and having entered into bond together with Henry Lloyd and Peter Burr his security it is ordered that the sheriff discharge him from custody until the matter is equitably determined.

On the petition of James Burr praying that a former order of this court made for binding Robert Tomkins to Thomas Postgate be revoked. It is ordered that the said petition be dismissed.
