Note: 1750, May 11. David Lloyd sells to son Henry Lloyd and Peter Burr his entire estate. Frederick County, Virginia, Deed Book 3, pp, 110-111.

Know all men by these presents that I David Lloyd of Frederick County in the Colony of Virginia do for and in consideration of sixty pounds current money in hand secured to my full satisfaction by my son Henry Lloyd and Peter Burr of the county and colony aforesaid -- do give grant bargain sell make over and confirm unto the said Henry Lloyd and Peter Burr their heirs and assigns executors or administrators all my estate as goods chattels bills bonds book debts all and every thing that I have in my possession or that may be recovered by law have bargained sold set over and delivered in plain and open market according to the full and due form of the law in that course made and provided to have and to hold the above granted and bargained premises unto the said Henry Lloyd and Peter Burr their heirs executors administrators or assigns for their own proper use benefit and behoof for ever furthermore I the said David Lloyd do for my self my heirs executors administrators warrant and defend the above granted and bargained premises against [page 111] my self or any claiming under me In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this eleventh day of May Anno Domini 1750.

N.B. The words to my full satisfaction between the third and fourth lines were writ before signing and sealing.

At a court continued and held for Frederick County on Saturday the 12 day of May 1750. This deed of bargain and sale from David Lloyd to Peter Burr and Henry Lloyd was proved in open Court by the oathes of Robert Buckles and Benjamin Bradley witnesses thereto the same was admitted to record.
